



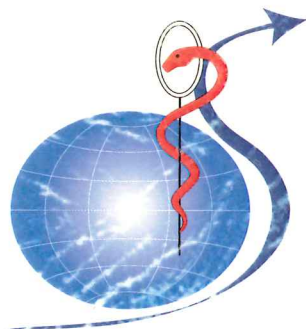
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

**THE FÉDÉRATION INTERNATIONALE PHARMACEUTIQUE
(FIP)**

AND

**THE INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF MILITARY MEDICINE
(ICMM)**



The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to facilitate and stimulate contact and co-operation between the Fédération Internationale Pharmaceutique, hereinafter referred to as "FIP" and the International Committee of Military Medicine, hereinafter referred to as "ICMM" through their respective Section and Technical Commission: the Military and Emergency Pharmacy Section (MEPS) and the Technical Commission for Pharmacy (TC Pharm), respectively, on all projects of common concern that could be launched in the future.

Considering that the mission of the FIP, as the global body representing pharmacy and pharmaceutical sciences, is that wherever and whenever decision-makers discuss any aspects of medicines on a global level, FIP is at the table.

Considering that the FIP endeavours to improve global health by advancing pharmaceutical education, pharmaceutical sciences and pharmaceutical practice thus encouraging, promoting and enabling better discovery, development, access to and responsible use of appropriate, cost-effective, quality medicines worldwide.

Considering that the mission of the ICMM, as an impartial, neutral and independent organisation is to facilitate, maintain and strengthen the bonds between all military medical services of its Member States in order to promote the exchange of scientific knowledge and practical experiences in the field of military medicine and to encourage, within its means and the operational framework, respect of and application of international humanitarian law and medical ethics.

Recognising the need for facilitating co-ordination and implementation of common projects about treatment of wounded, protection of lives and dignity of victims of armed conflict and other emergencies, the respect of International humanitarian law and ethical principles.

The FIP and the ICMM have agreed to the following:

Article 1. Reciprocal representation

Each organisation will invite the other party to participate as an observer in its meetings where matters of mutual interest may arise and make the reports of these meetings available.

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the FIP will also invite the Secretary General of the ICMM to participate in, or be represented at, without voting rights, the Council Meeting of the FIP as well as at other meetings of common interest. The Secretary General of the ICMM or his/her representative will have the opportunity to address the Council or give a presentation.

The details of the scheduling of any such intervention will be determined by the chair of the respective council/assembly or session.

Likewise, the Secretary-General of the ICMM will also invite the CEO of the FIP to participate in, or be represented at, without voting rights, the biennial General Assembly of the ICMM, organised during the World Congress of Military Medicine of the ICMM, where the CEO of the FIP or his/her representative, will have the opportunity to address the General Assembly of the ICMM or give a presentation at the World Congress. The details of the scheduling of any such intervention will be determined by the chair of the respective council/assembly or session.

Article 2. Exchange of information and documents

Subject to any arrangements which may be necessary to safeguard the confidentiality of certain documents, the FIP and the ICMM may exchange technical documents that can be distributed among the members of both organisations.

On the condition that the competent authority of the military health service of each affected member state gives its agreement, the ICMM can provide useful and non-confidential information that may be agreed upon between ICMM and FIP.

Ownership of such information shall remain with the party that provides it unless otherwise stated. Any publication or sharing beyond the organisation can only be made with the agreement of the document owner.

Article 3. Co-operation

The FIP and the ICMM agree to co-operate on the issues of mutual interest, in particular those concerning pharmacy, pharmaceutical sciences, health care and humanitarian assistance.

The FIP and the ICMM may agree on joint projects, in order to develop international cooperation in the field of health care as it relates to pharmacy and pharmaceutical sciences.

Article 4. Validity and duration

The present memorandum of understanding will enter into force once signed by both parties and shall be of indefinite duration.

Either party may propose written amendments to this MOU which, upon written agreement of the other party, shall be considered part of this MOU.

Either party may terminate this MOU at any time by an official notification giving to the other not less than three months' notice and stating the reasons for termination.


